


Care 2 Enterprise Theory of Change

Young carers previously identified for other projects and new beneficiaries, especially drawing on the information learnt from other projects and implementing best practices (CoMMent, EntrInnO). All of the partners specialise in Social Enterprise and can identify potential clients and partnerships.

All academic outputs will be screened by our Editorial Board who will peer review the evaluation and academic materials.

All stages will be overseen and receive input from youth-led focus groups (made up of members of our Youth Advisory Board) who will review input and outputs of training. The Youth Advisory Board will help advertise, critiquing and disseminating throughout the process.



Build on the existing social enterprise projects partners have been working on including SkillUP and PromYse, which will provide a base for local business networks.

Care2Work framework, now in e-course format, and piloted across Europe will feed into the materials created for this face to face training.

We will liaise with National Youth and Safeguarding Teams in order to ensure outputs to as many young people as possible.



Young people from 20 EU countries recruited onto the IARS youth network.	30 local young carers will receive training and this will be broadcast via webinar. 500 young carers/professionals to access online training.
20 young carers and 20 professionals from each country will be directly involved with implementation and testing of the platform.	15 stakeholders will come together to debate the project learnings at a conference
Production of regular newsletters in participating languages informing 3000 stakeholders. 100 journalists receiving press releases.	5,000 relevant stakeholders nationally will be informed about the project

100 local stakeholders receive youth-led CPD accredited training face to face and online

Outcomes

- By the end of the project we will have:
- An integrated social entrepreneurship capacity building and networking platform tailor-made to the needs of youth.
 - Youth-led research through accredited youth internships and volunteering
 - Better positioning of young carers as prospective social entrepreneurs
 - Enhanced capacity of partner organisations to promote youth employment in the social enterprise field
 - A EU network of young carers and entrepreneurs
 - Increased public awareness of young carers and the issues facing employment



- Reported increased empowerment and employment for young Carers within social enterprise
- Uptake of courses and completed accredited training
- Increase in the number of youth passes awarded to young people and increased employability will be reported
- Increased understanding of stakeholders supporting young carers
- Conference participants reporting that they feel more knowledgeable about the subject
